YORK MYSTERY ENGINE REVISITED Frank Carey

Ken Wilson was the first to respond. Here's what he wrote:

Frank.

Just finished reading the news letter. Back in 1970 when I was a member of the Flanders Fire Company, I drove a GMC COE 1000 gallon pumper. The year of the truck was mid 60's. It had the back to back V-6 or as some would call it a V12. The trans was a 5-speed with a hi/lo split rear. The truck had so much power it never had any problems with the mountains in Mt Olive Twp. When totally empty (sans water, hoses & ladders) you could light up the dual rear wheels and very easily start out in 3rd HI. Fred Detoro could probably remember the year. We were department members together. Please pass this on to the members.

When I questioned Ken about his back-to-back vs. the single V12 casting we saw at York he replied:

Frank.

"WE" called it back to back because of the 4 ... cylinder heads. It was a one piece V12 block.

Then Dave Myers called. As soon as he mentioned V12 I remembered that he has been a big truck mechanic forever. He knew all about these engines and had worked on many of them. They were made by GMC from the early 1960s until about 1970. They were gas engines of 702 cubic inches which yielded 300 hp. Any rodder who could get only 300hp from 702 cubic inches would surely be disappointed. Dave believes they were brought out because the diesels of the day did not have that much power. The heads used on the V12 were from the GMC 351 V-6, thus confirming my suspicions. Induction was via two 2-barrel carburetors, one between the front two heads and one between the rears. Dave says these carbs were huge and we laughed about what the CFM must have been, which makes me wonder why nobody has adapted them for street rod use. But maybe somebody already has! These V12 engines were commonly used in COE tractors used in over-the-road 18-wheeler configurations. Must have been a bummer to get only 3 mpg, the mileage Dave remembers. But gas was a lot cheaper then. I suppose 3 mpg would not have been such a problem at Ken's fire department where the trucks rarely left town.

So, case closed - with thanks to Ken and Dave.

Ford pickup stolen in LA recovered after 38 years

SAN FRANCISCO — Harold Voelker tucked away the ownership title and memories of his prized 1956 Ford F-100 pickup after it was stolen in 1972 in Los Angeles.

Both were dusted off when authorities told Mr. Voelker they had found the vehicle in Modesto — 38 years after it went missing.

"I go to car shows all the time, and I thought, I'm going to see it one of these days," Mr. Voelker, 63, said Thursday. "That was my baby."

Mr. Voelker retrieved the car Tuesday after it was discovered last week.

The California Highway Patrol said officials noticed a discrepancy in the vehicle identification number when a Modesto couple tried to register the truck after getting it from a relative in Texas who didn't know it had been stolen.

CHP Officer Greg Bennett found the original identification number and contacted Voelker, questioning him about the truck and where he had lived when it was stolen.

"He kept quizzing and quizzing, and I answered everything," Mr. Voelker said. "He said, 'Guess what, I have your truck sitting here.' I said, 'Is this a joke?"

Officer Bennett said it was an unusual discovery.

"There's definite gratification in getting

this guy his truck back, absolutely," he said.

Even so, Officer Bennett called the case bittersweet, because the Modesto couple lost the truck.

Mr. Voelker said the truck is running well and seems to have more power than he remembered.

There were some changes, however. Mr. Voelker said it was pale yellow when it was stolen but is now white. It also has alloy wheels, which Voelker plans to replace with original stainless steel hubcaps.

He also intends to install a theft alarm and park the truck in his garage.

"I'm thinking about getting plates that say, 'Back Home,' or "It's Back," he said.
