THE UNIVERSAL SOLVENT Frank Carey

We all use solvents. You choose a solvent that is appropriate for your needs - cleaning greasy parts, cleaning a paint brush, etc. You might use kerosene, turpentine, alcohol, paint thinner, or, perish the thought, gasoline. Scientists used to talk about how helpful it would be if there was just one solvent that would dissolve anything - a universal solvent. Sounds cool but what could you keep it in if it also dissolved the bottle! Anyhow, the closest thing I've ever found to a universal solvent was methyl-ethyl-keytone, or MEK. I was at work and needed to remove some masking tape that had dried hard on the floor. This was back in the 1970s. A guy suggested I get some MEK. I got a bottle from our chemical stockroom and it work beautifully. Then one day we all got bulletins announcing that OSHA considers MEK to be dangerous. Anybody who needed MEK had to first attend a class about the dangers of MEK. This was scary and I returned my bottle to the stockroom.

Fast forward a decade or two. I bought a can of carburetor cleaner and discovered how well it cleaned lots of different things. I read the label and learned that it contained a non-trivial amount of MEK. Cool. I observed the warnings about not getting any on my skin. This stuff was so good it made my carbs look new. When I needed another can I discovered that carb cleaner no longer contained MEK. OSHA must have had something to do with that. I then discovered injector cleaner. It had MEK in it. Not a lot, but by this time I'd take anything. It's a small bottle and wasn't cheap. I've never needed it for injectors but use it on just about everything else. The other day I discovered my putty knife had some sticky stuff on it that I couldn't wipe off. Injector cleaner to the rescue. It made the putty knife look new.

I've had this bottle of injector cleaner for a long time and I use it sparingly. I don't know if today's injector cleaner still has MEK or if it went the way of carb cleaner. So if you've got anything with MEK in it - carb cleaner, injector cleaner, or anything else - be very careful in handling and using it and use it sparingly because you may not be able to get another can with the same formulation.
