BATTERY BOOSTER PACKS Frank Carey

OK, I'm going to take a chance and tell you something you might already know. If so, just skip to the next item.

Battery booster packs have been around for quite a while and I suspect most of you have one. And you probably realize that these things have a 12V battery inside. That's why they're heavy. But it's a sealed battery. Like a regular car battery, these batteries have a finite life expectancy and last week I began to suspect that my battery booster pack was terminally ill. But how could I be sure. I can't check the acid with a hydrometer because it's sealed. So I decided to check it with my trusty Taiwan-made load tester. When I couldn't get a reading I wasn't sure if this was an indication of my battery pack's condition or an indication of the quality of the load tester. So nothing was learned.

Coincidentally, I needed to go buy a battery for a car and took the battery pack along to the Interstate battery store to see if they could test it. I learned a lot. Interstate sell these battery packs. They come in a wide range of amperages as do regular car batteries. I just never thought of that. They even sell a huge battery booster pack that will start a diesel. I never thought of that either. He tested mine and it was indeed deceased. Then the big surprise: He could sell me a new battery to put in my battery pack. He said most people don't know that these batteries are replaceable and they just throw out the old battery booster pack and buy a new one. But there's a catch: The replacement batteries are expensive – not too far from the cost of a whole new booster pack. A new battery for mine was \$65.00. So I decided to buy a new battery booster pack with greater booster power than was available in my old one. But you might want to replace the battery in yours when its time comes.

SECOND ORDER ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS Frank Carey
