The first new one I noticed is: American Street Rod Association. For those interested, their web site is www.americanstreetrodassociation.com



Well, the cat's out of the bag. I'm writing the club history – or, rather, trying to write the club history. And I'll need your help. The early club picture that ran in the last newsletter was familiar to me and I had it. Or, rather, I thought I had it. I had been busy trying to identify members pictured and to estimate the date. But when I looked at the newsletter picture I realized there were more cars in that picture that in the one I had. How could that be? I still don't know. Perhaps the photographer kept taking picture as guys were arriving and I have one of the earlier ones.

Identifying the guys in the front was fairly easy. But identifying those in the back was virtually impossible. So we're left with trying to identify the cars and then try to remember who owned cars like that. Perhaps you can help with this "back row" approach. Here's the picture I have. I've put in the names that are our best guesses.

Well, I see I can't fit the whole picture onto this page. But that's OK because I'm confident we know the guys whose names are off the page. The 32 5-window was Hank Peters, the 41 Chevy sedan was Buddy Potts, and the deuce tudor was – and is – Charlie Parinello. Oh, the roadster in front was Ed Flanagan. I need help with the back row, especially Carpenter, Turi, Zimmerman, and Sanford. We know these named guys owned cars like those in the picture but are these the guys pictured? Help! And, of course, let me know if you think any of the others are misidentified.

I'm working on the names of the additional guys who are in the newsletter picture but not in mine. The 39 or 40 coupe on the right could be either Bill Pries or Charlie Bollenbach. Pries had a 40 Standard and Bollenbach had a 39 Deluxe. I can't see enough detail in the newsletter picture to differentiate these two models. Maybe your eyesight (or memory) is better than mine. The 40 deluxe tudor might be Bob Sellitto. Or if it's actually a sedan delivery it would be Rick Clydesdale. And the deuce tudor in the very back might be Dick VanNiekerk. More Help! The date given with the newsletter picture is probably correct. We guessed 1974. I'll fix that.

I'm getting bits and pieces of info about a huge fire at a street rod shop. That said, everything else here is my best effort to piece together the various tidbits and figure out what happened. Apparently the fire was at Arizona Street Rods, a large rod shop servicing the street rodders in Arizona. And I've come across a photo that appears to be from that incident. This picture was taken from up on a fire department hook and ladder – or whatever you now call those big trucks with the ladders that are mounted on the vehicle and extend up. Study this picture and you can make out several traditional style rods. I have no idea when this occurred.

(I found some additional info on the net - Phoenix based Arizona Street Rods operated out of a 15,000 sq. ft. building at this location for ther past 32 years. As you can see in Frank's photo, a number of collecter cars were lost. A '64 Corvette (should be the one to the left) was owned by the same guy for 47 years) Fire officials say the blaze started inside the building, and the abundance of flammables made it inpossible to extinguish it quickly.
